

What is the Heckington Show?

The highlight of the village year, it provides two days of entertainment and activity for the whole family. There are both adults and children's events to enter, plus a variety of other competitions, races, stalls, activities and shows, as well as live entertainment in the main ring. There is a grand firework concert held on the Saturday evening too.

When does it take place?

The last full weekend in July, this year on Saturday 29th and Sunday 30th.

Where is it held?

The Hall Grounds, Eastgate, Heckington - the home of the show since 1867.

What are the events?

This booklet gives details on all the children's events, and there are a whole range of adult events too including horticulture, cookery, craft, art and photography and more. Details can be found from the Windmill Shop, Donaldsons or via www.heckingtonshow.org.uk.

There are different classes of events (detailed on the following pages) - all require you to complete an entry form and this must be submitted by Wednesday 26th July. You can enter by:

- returning the form in this booklet to Heckington school or pre-school, Helpringham school or 9 Cowgate by Friday 7th July.
- entering online via the website www.heckingtonshow.org.uk.
- entering at the village hall between 5.30pm and 8:00pm on Wednesday 26th July.

There will be no late entries for cycling, running or obstacle course on the Saturday morning, so please ensure you enter in advance. Entries made for the cycling, running or obstacle course before Friday 7th July receive a free child's ticket to the show.

There is a small entry fee of 20p for most events, and there are cash prizes awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th places. The running and cycling events are free with medals awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.

Event submissions will need to be brought to the showground on either Friday 28th July between 6.00pm and 9.00pm or Saturday 29th July between 7.00am and 8.30am.

16 YEARS AND UNDER COOKERY CONTINUED

420 6 Pieces of fudge

421 Soda Bread (from Paul Hollywood's Bread Book)

Recipe: 250g plain wholemeal flour, 250g plain white flour plus extra for dusting, 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda, 1tsp salt, 420ml buttermilk (or plain yoghurt)

Method: Mix both flours together with the bicarbonate of soda and salt. Add buttermilk or yoghurt and mix to form a sticky dough. Tip dough onto a floured surface and gently roll and fold the dough for a minute, do not knead. Shape into a ball and flatten gently with your hand.

Place on a baking tray lined with baking parchment and dust with the white flour. Using a knife score the loaf deeply, dividing into quarters, set aside for 30 minutes.

Bake at 200°C for 30 minutes and leave to cool completely.

422 4 decorated biscuits – homemade to represent the four seasons.

423 4 chocolate brownies

424 4 muffins – any flavour

425 Victoria sandwich cake, 2 18cm cakes sandwiched with raspberry jam and dusted with caster sugar.

426 4 cheese scones

427 3 different small cakes presented for a tea party.

428 4 emoji decorated cupcakes

429 A gingerbread house (max 20cm²)

430 6 'Millstone Crunch' flapjacks (see recipe below)

Recipe: 100g wholemeal flour, 200g porridge oats, 200g margarine, 200g Demerara sugar, a pinch of salt.

Method: Melt the margarine in a large saucepan and remove from the heat. Add the remaining ingredients and mix well. Spread evenly in a swiss roll tin or similar but do not press down too firmly.

Bake in a moderate oven for about 15 minutes until just starting to brown. Cool in the tin and when almost cold cut into fingers.

When do I need to enter by

Entries can be made in a variety of ways (see page 2) but must be made by Wednesday 26th July.

You don't need to have your exhibit ready then, you just need to enter to say you will be bringing one to be included in the competition.

How much is it to enter?

20p per entry. Running and cycling free.

When do I take my entry to the show?

Take your exhibit to the horticulture marquee on the Showground. It is open from 6.00pm to 9.00pm on Friday 29th July and from 7.00am to 8.30am on Saturday 30th July.

Where do I need to go for the cycling, running and obstacle course?

You will receive a letter with your numbers in. Bring these and come along to the Showground on Saturday morning to the Children's Sports Tent near the Grandstand at

9.20am. – with your bike if you are cycling or

9.35 am. - if you are running or doing the obstacle course.

What if I win?

Prizes for the sports will be given out straightaway. Prizes for exhibits will be given out in the Horticulture Marquee between 2.30pm and 5.00pm on Sunday 30th July.

A board at the front of the Horticulture Marquee displays who has won the trophies. If you have won, there is a special presentation at 3.30pm in the Concert Marquee.

Can I keep my exhibit?

Yes, it can be collected between 5.00pm and 6.30pm on Sunday 30th July.
